
UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S 2 LEARNING!

NURSERY TEAM UPDATE!

This week in Nursery, we have been learning about repetition and patterns; using natural resources to create our own patterns but also listening to stories which have repeated words in, such as 'Funny Bones'.

We are really enjoying our Story Dough session and we are seeing the result of it as children use more vocabulary and their imaginations in our whole class story sessions.

As part of our topic 'Getting to Know You', we have talked about our bodies, learnt about healthy foods and body parts by singing 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes'.



RECEPTION TEAM UPDATE

This week, we have been very busy. We have been learning all about real owls and some fun facts to share. We discussed how they're different to us, as they are nocturnal. The children have been doing some beautiful writing, sharing their new knowledge.

In maths, we have been developing our understanding of subitising, making sure were quick to find the number, not needing to count. The children have been applying their knowledge to both indoor and outdoor provisions. They have worked very hard and are continuing to challenge themselves.

In forest school we found out how to make a bow and 'arrow' with sticks. Mr Clancy showed children the skill of aiming and shooting at our tarp. The children found it very exciting, challenging each other on how many they can each fire. We also developed our listening skills through a game of 'farmer farmer'. Here, they had to ensure they listened to who could cross and who couldn't.

Another busy week in Reception is done and we look forward to seeing you again for our final week before half



UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S 2 LEARNING!

YEAR 1 TEAM UPDATE

Year 1 have become scientists this week to investigate which two items when placed together fizz. This tested our sense of hearing as we had to listen carefully to whether it fizzed or not!

In literacy we have written our letter back to the Big Bad Wolf about his behaviour. The children had lots of great ideas of how we could respond, and they helped Miss Yates to fix her sentences so that she included capital letters, full stops, and finger spaces!

In maths, we have continued to develop a strong understanding of number by making comparisons using the terms greater than and fewer than. The children have started to think really carefully about problem solving and have started to record their ideas in their books using 'I think that.... because'.

In history, we have continued to build upon our knowledge of technology in the past using our notes from our grandparents and looking at real images of different forms of entertainmenttelevision, record and cassette players and gaming. The children are developing a fantastic understanding of technology in the past and how it is similar or different to technology today.
