

#### UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S 2 **LEARNING!**

#### **NURSERY TEAM** UPDATE!

This week in Nursery, we have enjoyed spending time with the children and settling them back into their school routines.

In Literacy, we have been reading the story 'Rosie's Walk' by Pat Hutchins. We have enjoyed looking in detail at the pictures, learning the verbs in the book and adding our own actions for them.

In Maths, our focus for this week was to learn number rhymes and represent numbers using our fingers. The children have been fantastic at this - see if they can remember any of them at home.

In our classroom, the children have been serving up treats in our 'Gingerbread Cafe', creating firework pictures and using scissors to cut along lines.

Thank you to all the parents/carers who shared half-term photos - we do love sharing these during our snack time.



#### **RECEPTION TEAM UPDATE**



This week in reception, we have been busy getting back into our routines. The children have settled back in well, eager to learn! They have shown great persistence and resilience in all areas.

This week in Talk 4 writing, we have been looking at Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children helped each other draw a whole class story map and then transfer this knowledge into their own story map. They used story language and drew beautiful images to recreate the story.

In maths, we have been sorting circles and triangles, discussing the language we should use to describe them. We have been using our knowledge of 1,2 and 3 to count our sides of a triangle and also spot these shapes around our school.

We looked into the celebration of Diwali, designed some henna and our very own Diya lamps. The children really immersed themselves in this tradition, comparing it some we've learnt about before and some of their own that they celebrate. In p.e we have been practising our ball skills, controlling the ball and also ensuring that there is enough force behind it to control it.

#### UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S 2 **LEARNING!**

#### **YEAR 1 TEAM UPDATE**

We have had a fabulous first week back. It has been lovely seeing all of our children again and finding out all about what they have been up to in the holidays. We have particularly enjoyed looking at Tapestry so thank you for your posts.

We have been introduced to our new book for this half term in Literacy. The children became detectives and found some clues left in the classroom to predict what our new book could be. A red and white striped hat, a little brown suitcase, a fluffy penguin and a lost tag were all items found in a familiar book to the children called 'Lost and Found'. We have been creating, rehearsing and creating actions to our class story map of the text.

In maths we have started to use our previous knowledge of number bonds, 10 frames and careful counting to investigate addition. We have even started to record number sentences into our books!

Technology. The children are looking forward to designing and creating different types of puppets using a range of materials and techniques. I wonder if they can remember any of the 5 different types of puppet we have learnt this week and what type of puppet we have created during Continuous Provision.

In our first Geography lesson we explored different types of map. We noticed that when looking at a world map it was quite tricky to spot where we live as our country is so small! Luckily, Miss Yates found some more detailed maps of the United Kingdom, England, Staffordshire and then Fradley. We took our learning further by looking on Google Earth to see a bird's eye view of the school and even a street view!

#### **YEAR 2 TEAM** UPDATE

It has been a great first week back after half term.

The children have all got stuck in with their learning. In Maths this week Year 2 have been working hard to subtract two 2-digit numbers. They have worked hard to remember the strategies they have been previously taught.

In English this week, we have started looking at the story The Papaya that Spoke and we have been recapping retelling the story and creating our writing tool kit.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the art workshop on Wednesday and enjoyed doing observation drawings of animals and people and had a really good effort at painting. They completed all this work with a local artist that took the session.
