

# **NURSERY TEAM** UPDATE!

This week in Nursery, we have been learning the nursery rhyme 'Hickory Dickory Dock' and practising our the letter sound 't'. The children are really starting to grasp this and are getting used to the fun games we use to explore letter sounds.

We had a chilly Forest School session where we collected the last bits of snow and built a den to keep cosy. On Wednesday, we enjoyed exploring ice that had formed on our tuff spots and added it to our water tray.

In our classroom we have begun to talk about Winter and the changes we will see in our natural environment. In Maths, we have continued our work on subitising and spotting 1, 2 and 3 items around our school. This week we have also explored different music, how it makes us feel and made our own musical instruments. As well as all of this the children continue to inspire us with their creative play - creating storylines in everything they do.

# **RECEPTION TEAM UPDATE**



In reception this week we have been further exploring our Goldilocks book but adding in our own edits. As a class we edited the story to have foxes, jam sandwiches and grass instead of chairs. The children's creativity shone 5roughiut our group work when they wrote their own sentences in their books!

In maths we have been exploring number 1-5, looking at one more and one less than these. The children got to use their skill of subitising from last week, to spot which numbers had been hidden from the sequences. They were also using their reasoning language to explain why they knew the number was missing.

In forest school, we had lots of fun exploring muddy puddles, the new slide area, building dens and making mud cakes. The children listened carefully to instructions from Mr Clancy, making sure they were having fun but staying safe. We have started practising our nativity songs and the children are fantastic! We are so excited to show you all the finished show in a few weeks time!

# **YEAR 1 TEAM UPDATE**

This week in maths we have been working on finding out a missing part in our part-whole models. This meant we had to subtract the whole number from the part using concrete resources.

In literacy we have been innovating our story of Lost and Found. The children have all thought of some wonderful ideas of the different animals the boy could meet and where they travelled to.

In D&T we have been learning how to complete a running stitch. Miss Yates and Mrs Deakin were very impressed with the children's perseverance with attempting this tricky skill. We will continue to practise this again next week alongside trialling an Over Stitch before the children design their puppets and decide how they are going to make them.


In maths we have been continuing to look at shapes. The children have been working hard to identify vertices, sides and starting to draw the shapes using rulers.
