

### UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S 3 LEARNINGL

**NURSERY TEAM UPDATE!** 

This week we have fully embraced autumn and our children have been developing their control, grip and precision by using hammers. The children then removed golf tees from the pumpkins using pliers.

We have also been fostering new language by digging inside the pumpkins and describing what they could feel and smell.

Finally the exploration tray has been home to an autumn collection and our children have enjoyed using the tweezers to make soups and potions.

A highlight has been the campfire, toasting marshmallows and telling stories.

Wow! We cannot believe we have completed our first half term in Reception! The children have all done incredibly well at settling into their new class and understanding the new routines in place. We are so proud of them all.

In literacy this week we have had a focus on handwriting and letter formation. The children have written their names in their literacy books again this week and the improvement they have all made since the beginning of this half term is amazing!

# UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S 4 LEARNING!

YEAR 1 TEAM UPDATE

In English, this week we have focused on consolidating our knowledge on writing letters. We have been busy writing letters to Mrs Allen all about what clubs we would love to do at Fradley. We had such lovely ideas ranging from reading, scooter skills and football club and many more fabulous ideas.

In Maths we have began using our knowledge of parts and wholes to create number sentences and complete part whole models. We have discussed what resources we could you use, where to find them? And the key vocabulary.

In computing we were able to experiment with different media including wax crayons, coloured pencils, and the different tools on the iPads to draw pictures. We then were able to discuss what we enjoyed using most.

In Art we had our own mini art exhibition, showing off the art we have created over the last few weeks! We were so proud to share the beautiful spiral creations. The children were very complimentary of each other's work and were able to begin to reflect on their own work.

In music this week we rehearsed the menu song for the last time and put our final actions to it. The children were then recorded on the class iPad and were able to listen to it back. They have done os well learning a new song, keeping their singing to the beat, and getting so involved

The final week of the first half term is upon us! What a jam-packed half term it has been. The children have been working extremely hard.

In literacy this week we have been creating our own leaflets to persuade families to visit our innovated Pirate Adventure Parks. We have been including colourful pictures, using superlatives and asking engaging questions to try and persuade families to visit.

In maths we have continued to practise addition with a particular focus on adding by making 10, adding three 1 digit numbers together and bridging to the next multiple of 10.

Not only have we been thinking about trying to eat 5 portions of fruit and vegetables a day in Science we have been completing a Digital 5 a Day is about having a 'balanced digital diet'. The children enjoyed recording messages, taking photos and getting creative on the iPads! They had to remember to ask permission from others if they wanted to take a photo of them.

Our vehicles are almost complete and will hopefully be ready to show you at the beginning of next term where Mr. Yates will visit us again to see how we have been getting on!

## YEAR 3 TEAM UPDATE



Year 3 have had a really busy last week of this half term! Maths lessons have been extremely this week, where the children learn how to use the column method for both addition and subtraction. They have worked extremely hard and should be so proud of their achievements!

In English, they finished their writing to sell their gingerbread house - they generated some impressive rhetorical questions and sentences using imperative verbs, persuading the reader to buy the house!

In DT, the children were creative when investigating shell structures - designing and making their own packaging for biscuits. They made links to maths, investigating the nets of 3D shapes and constructing their own net templates, which were really impressive! They also practised different ways of shaping card in preparation for making their own biscuit packaging. What a creative bunch they are! Some of the children enjoyed our Spooky and Sparkly disco this week - I loved seeing their amazing costumes!

Carol Service rehearsals are also well underway for our performance at St. Stephen's church on 12th December - 1:45pm. We have been busy learning the songs and presenting our lines - please support your child with learning these at home. All songs are available on Tapestry.

In computing, we investigated the pros and cons to drawing on a digital device rather than using paper and pencils and discussed the situations when digital technology might be useful. Many of us still preferred drawing by hand!

# SAFEGUARDING UPDATE Safeguarding



#### **Minecraft Child Safety Settings**

Minecraft itself doesn't have a big built-in "parental control" menu but depending on how your child plays (Java Edition, Bedrock/Windows, or console), you can manage what they can do through a mix of Microsoft account family settings, platform parental controls, and server/world settings.

#### Bedrock Edition (Windows, iOS, Android, Xbox, PlayStation, Switch)

- Microsoft Family Safety
  - Log into your child's Microsoft account via family.microsoft.com.
  - You can set:
    - Screen time limits.
    - · Spending limits (requires adult approval for purchases).
    - · Restrictions on joining multiplayer/Realms.
    - · Restrictions on adding friends.

#### Xbox/Console Parental Controls

- Each console (Xbox, PlayStation, Switch) has its own parental settings that allow you to:
  - Restrict online play.
  - Control voice/text chat.
  - · Block joining servers or Realms.
  - · Limit age-rated content.

#### Java Edition (PC/Mac)

Java doesn't have built-in parental settings, so you'll need to manage through:

- Server settings: If your child plays on your own hosted server, you can whitelist who's allowed to join, disable chat, or use plugins/mods to filter messages.
- Launcher account: Java Edition is tied to a Microsoft account now, so you can still apply Microsoft Family Safety rules (e.g. screen time, purchase approval).
- Chat reporting: Mojang added reporting and chat filters—strong language and personal info can be filtered automatically if enabled in account settings.

#### **General Safety Options**

- Mute Chat / Toggle Chat (both editions): You can turn chat off in settings to stop interaction with strangers.
- Realms vs Servers: Realms are invite-only (safer). Public servers often have less control over content and players.
- Resource Packs / Add-ons: Keep an eye on downloads; use only trusted sources (Marketplace or well-known modding sites).
- Play Together Locally: On consoles or LAN, kids can play with just friends/family without internet strangers.
