
Upcycled Loose Parts



NURSERY TEAM UPDATE!

This week our roleplay area has turned into a post office, the children have loved taking the role of postman/postwoman and working in the post office. The children have really enjoyed writing postcards, adding stamps and posting the letters.

We have been reading the story *We're Going on Bear Hunt*. The children have loved learning the story and acting out it out using the repetitive story language. We have even made a giant class bear collage which we have painted and decorated.

The children are now becoming more confident with using Numicon and recognising the numbers. We have also used tweezers and pom-poms to show the total amount.



UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S LEARNING!

RECEPTION TEAM UPDATE



This week in Reception we have continued with our story '*Whatever Next!*'. The children have really enjoyed creating a whole class story map and retelling our story with actions. We have also written a list of things we would take to space if we were Baby Bear.

In maths we have been exploring mass and capacity. The children have loved using the balancing scales to explore heavy and light objects and finding the mass of classroom items.

In PE we continued to focus on our *Jack and the Beanstalk* gymnastics! This week our focus was jumping and landing safely and accurately off a bench onto a small base station.

UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S LEARNING!

YEAR 1 TEAM UPDATE

In English we have been getting our creative imagination heads on to innovate our story of farmer duck. The children have changed their main character and have began adapting part of the story.

In maths this week we have been estimating on a number line. The children have worked well to recognise where halfway is on the number line to help them accurately estimate what the missing numbers are or where a number might be.

In DT we had a go at creating our own carp kites. The children had to put their gluing and sticking skills to the test to create their colourful carp kites. They can't wait to take them home.

In PSHE the children have been thinking about accomplishments over the last couple weeks and how we can set goals and reach them. The children have created their own accomplishment box that they can take and write their accomplishments on a paper and put it inside. A great way to remember all the amazing things they have done!



YEAR 2 TEAM UPDATE



In literacy this week, we were surprised to find Little Red Riding Hood's hood in our classroom and the cookery room left in a bit of a mess. We enjoyed baking biscuits using the ingredients left by Little Red Riding Hood.

In literacy, we have been exploring our senses to describe a setting and developing our understanding of similes. We have been generating our own ideas.

In maths, we have been creating amounts using a combination of coins and comparing amounts.

We had a bit of a wet and soggy Forest School but that didn't stop the children from having a great time! Thank you to Darcey for snapping some lovely photos!

In science we have been exploring habitats and identifying which animals would belong in each and why.

UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S LEARNING!

YEAR 3 TEAM UPDATE

This week, year 3 have been combining their learning in Science, Geography and Forest School. They have been learning about the structure of plants, thinking about the best conditions in which they need to grow. The children had to decide whether they wanted to deprive the plants of air, water or soil. They made predictions about what they thought would happen and have been monitoring their plants with excitement all week! They have found that some grew better than others and were able to decide how accurate their predictions were. In addition, they have been learning about the different parts of flowering plants, linking this to their learning about bees and pollination. In Forest School, they created a map (using their compasses to help them!) to map out areas that they could improve to be more bee friendly. They have lots of great plans!

In maths, the children have been looking at multiplication of a two-digit number by a one-digit number. This has been a very tricky concept but the children have persevered, many mastering this difficult skill. Please look out for further practice on tapestry!

In English, they have been planning how to catch the dragon that was spotted last week at Fradley Park! They have been planning some fantastic, creative writing pieces that we have published at the end of the week! Look out for some fantastic examples being shared! Next week, we will move onto our next fiction piece which is called 'The Magic Brush' We wonder what the children's magic brushes will paint...

Please look out for letters in your child's school bag about some wonderful opportunities we have coming up in Year 3.



SAFEGUARDING UPDATE

Dangerous dragon on the rampage in OUR village!



BREAKING NEWS: DRAGON SPOTTED IN FRADLEY!

Over the last few days, an **orange and green dragon** has been seen flying over the village of Fradley near Lichfield! The creature has been spotted in the mornings and evenings, and now school staff at Fradley Park Primary are very worried.
