UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S LEARNING!

NURSERY TEAM UPDATE!

This week in Nursery, the children have really enjoyed using counting baskets. In Maths the children were given a number and they had to count out that many pieces of fruit or vegetables. They have started to understand the cardinal principle which is 'the last number counted in a set represents the total number of objects in that set'. The children are becoming excellent mathematicians. We have also had a great time building homes for farm animals using a vast array of different materials. Finally, our World Book Day celebrations have enabled us to continue our love of reading. It was lovely to welcome parents into the Nursery classroom to read with their child and to see and hear all about their wonderful words and costumes. We have also been really enjoying reading and acting out the story of Jasper's Beanstalk and our own beanstalk is starting to grow too.



RECEPTION TEAM UPDATE



This week in Reception we have continued with our story of The Little Red Hen. The children have moved to the innovate part of our Talk For Writing journey and have changed the story by saying that the hen made pizza topped with cheese, pineapple, pepperoni and mushrooms!

In maths we have been learning about number bonds to 10. The children have been using ten frames and part-whole models to show this practically. We have also been exploring the patterns we can see when we write all the number bonds to 10 down.

The children have played with such wonderful imagination this week too. Outside we set up our obstacle course as a racing car! We added tyres for wheels and all climbed aboard! Children were pretending to be mechanics to change flat tyres and others drew road markings on the floor with chalk.

UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S LEARNING!

YEAR 1 TEAM UPDATE

In English we have been boxing up our innovated Jack and the beanstalk stories this week. It is always lovely to read and listen to their wonderful ideas and amazing adjectives.

In maths the children have been recognising and learning about numbers to 50. They have been grouping 10's, recognising the tens and ones in each number and counting forwards and backwards. They have tried so hard.

In art we have been making our own visual notes based on the artist Paul Klee. He uses watercolour and creates shapes and symbols ranging in different colours.

In PE the children had a wonderful yoga lesson. We created and performed different animal poses which the children were able to practice whilst I read a story with the animals in. It was a lovely calm lesson.



YEAR 2 TEAM UPDATE



This week has been a super busy week!

In maths we finally finished our topic on Multiplication and Division. We are looking forward to starting out unit on measurement next. It's great to hear that children are practising their times tables at home on TTRockstars.

In Literacy, we have been improving sentences through short burst writing. The children have so many fantastic ideas and changes. We have been improving our adjectives, changing our nouns and building upon our verbs.

In D&T we have been making our first drafts of what we would like to create for our Easter cards. We had to think carefully about whether we wanted to include a slider or lever.

UPDATES ON THIS WEEK'S LEARNING!

YEAR 3 TEAM UPDATE

We have had a really lovely week in Year 3 and have been happy to see the sun shining! It was lovely to get outside for PE this week!

In our computing lessons, we have begun to look at branching databases. The children learnt the difference between open and closed questions. They then applied these to create their own branching databases, which were very creative!

In maths, the children have begun to look at fractions. They looked at the difference between unit and non-unit fractions and used the language of 'whole', 'parts', 'numerator' and 'denominator'. We are looking forward to learning more about this unit this term!

In English, the children started planning their wishing tale. They compared our model text to Aladdin and thought about how this could inspire our own stories. I have been really impressed with the children's independent written work that they have been inspired to write at home - we have had lots of entries in the Golden Book this week! Please keep them coming - I love reading them and the children love to present them to the class!

The children loved guessing each others' word costumes during World Book Day - thank you for all of the effort that you have put into these!


SAFEGUARDING UPDATE



An important message from Staffordshire's Education Safeguarding Advice Service which is worth being aware of if you have older children:

We wanted to bring your attention to a worrying trend currently circulating on social media called 'School Warz'. This challenge is gaining traction across the country and encourages pupils to identify their school as either 'Red' or 'Blue', with schools then arranging to 'battle' in person. Worryingly, participants score points for bringing items typically found in schools, and in some cases, even gain extra points for bringing bladed weapons to these so-called 'fights'. Thankfully, we haven't received any reports that Staffordshire schools have been affected by this trend so far.

The police have asked that if you receive any information or hear of incidents related to 'School Warz', please notify them using the Police Intel Form. For immediate concerns, do report these directly through 101 or 999 as appropriate, and always follow your usual safeguarding protocols.






About: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756 – 1791) was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical period. Despite his short life, his rapid pace of composition resulted in more than 800 works of virtually every genre of his time. Many of these compositions are acknowledged as pinnacles of the symphonic, concertante, chamber, operatic, and choral repertoire. Mozart is widely regarded as among the greatest composers in the history of Western music. His Requiem was largely unfinished by the time of his death at the age of 35, the circumstances of which are uncertain and much mythologised.
